Probate & Estate Administration

The period immediately after a person dies can be a traumatic and confusing time. Along with making arrangements for the funeral, the family is then faced with the daunting prospect of administering the deceased's estate.

The role of the Personal Representative carries with it a number of responsibilities. They have a duty to collect in and protect the assets of the deceased.

They must make enquiries about the deceased's assets and their financial position and are responsible for ensuring that the terms of the will or statutory rules relating to intestacy are properly carried out.

They must also make sure that the necessary formalities are completed with HM Revenue and Customs and ensure all tax liabilities of the deceased are settled. They will also have to arrange for the disposal or transfer of the deceased's assets including the family home and contents.

Banks and other institutions sometimes only release funds when they have a formal Grant of Representation appointing the Personal Representatives. This is the Court's order issued to the Executors where a will has been made or the Administrator where there is no will (intestacy).

A Personal Representative who fails to discharge these duties properly will be personally accountable for any financial loss that occurs. They may also face criminal sanctions.
